You don't have to live in Florida or Arizona to be able to ride through the winter instead of storing your motorcycle. With the right tools in your back pocket, you can ride year-round.



Riding in cold weather takes a toll on us, and we want to stay as safe and comfortable as possible. Some will say my nice warm truck is better than riding in the cold and that is fine. However, some of us actually enjoy taking on the challenge of winter riding. I don't ride as far or as often in the winter, but even short rides can improve your mood and keep you from getting rusty come spring.

If you plan on riding in the winter and not winterize your motorcycle, there are some challenges you will face that require extra planning and a little bit of crazy. The challenges of winter riding fall into three categories: Environment, Equipment and Body.

**Environment** – One of the things to watch for is loss of traction with hidden ice. Even if you go out and it's sunny and dry with temperatures in the 40s you can still encounter leftover frost or ice in shaded or low-lying areas where trees or other buildings block the sun. It is never good to ride carefree and unaware of your surroundings. In the winter you have to be even more alert than in dry and warmer conditions. The dangers of salt on the road can be similar to sand or gravel on the pavement and even a fine dusting of salt reduces your tire's grip. We know about the corrosive damage road salt does to our motorcycles and for many people that's reason enough not to ride in the winter. Another thing motorcyclists might not consider during winter months are tar snakes. They are as much of a hazard in the cold-weather as they are in the hot days of summer. In the heat they get gooey and slippery. In the winter those asphalt patches will turn hard and slick. With the wonderful freeze-thaw cycles, snowplows can gouge the roadways. Potholes can pop up out of nowhere on roads you normally ride, so be alert for hazards.

**Equipment** - Cold tires can factor in how safe your cold morning ride will be. Stay on top of your bike maintenance if you want to continue riding in the winter. Salt can do a job on components of a motorcycle, like the brakes. Your brake cables are not going to move as freely as the temperature drops. If you park outside, ice can buildup on parts of the motorcycle. So make sure you check everything before you throw your leg over and start to ride.

**Body** - When thinking about the cold, how will you keep your body warm? There are a lot of winter riding gear you can purchase to make you as comfortable and alert as possible in lower temperatures. There are several heated gear options, or you can just wear multiple layers with a rain suit and boot covers on top to keep the wind off of you. As your body temperature decreases so does your ability to react and think critically. Being uncomfortable with so many layers that you look like the little brother Randy from "A Christmas Story" can also take away from being able to focus and slow your reaction time if you can't move around easily.

Remember the 3 W's when layering - Wicking, Warming and Wind breaking. Wearing a long-sleeved shirt designed to wick perspiration, heated grips, and gauntlet gloves can all play into staying warm, along with your layering. Don't forget your head and feet lose body heat as well. Wearing a full faced helmet and a neck warmer can make a difference along with warm wool socks, or something similar.

Another option for winter riding? Put away that fancy Harley for the winter and buying a winter bike. This could be a great excuse to buy another motorcycle. One option is to buy a cheap dual-sport motorcycle. The dual-sport tires work well in the cold, and the light weight and less power makes it easier to gain traction when conditions are not what you thought they would be when you headed out for the day. Another bike isn't an option? Well, you can still ride safely in the winter time if you follow these tips outlined above.

**POST EVENT REPORTS****ROAD CAPTAIN INFORMATIONAL MEETING****February 2****Brett Allies, Lead Road Captain**

The February 2nd Road Captain Informational Meeting was well attended and very productive. Twenty-eight of the 30 current Road Captains were in attendance along with 5 prospective road captains.

Topics covered:

- **Flow of Communications:** A change in the flow of communications between the Road Captains, the Lead Road Captain, and the distribution of information to the chapter web master, the secretary, and the newsletter editor were introduced.
- In an effort to simplify the process and reduce the risk of information being misplaced, all information will now flow through the Lead Road Captain for verification before being posted on the chapter calendar, the email blast, newsletter, and the chapter Face Book page. This includes pre ride promotions, post ride reports, ride cancelations before time for Kick Stands Up.
- **Level of Ride Difficulty:** In an ongoing emphasis towards safety, a "Level of Ride Difficulty", was introduced. This additional information will hopefully allow newer and new to the area riders to make good judgment calls before joining a ride.
- **Updated Incident Form:** An update to the current HOG Incident Form was also introduced. Updates included filling in the IMCHOG name, Chapter number, and information showing which areas of the form need to be filled out at the time of the incident. This should help a Road Captain, if and when, they have to fill one out in the future.
- **Change in Ride Requests:** A change in the way Ride Request will be submitted was introduced. No longer will paper slips be used, we have gone fully electronic. The new Ride Request form resembles our current use of the RSVP form used in many of our events. This should make life easier for everyone involved, especially the Road Captains, when it comes entering a ride request.



We also discussed how the Road Captain information will be presented at the General Meetings this year to streamline everything. When their ride is announced, the Road Captain will stand at their seat and microphone will be brought to them to give a brief description of the upcoming ride; no more than two minutes.

We are off to another year and looking forward to a great riding season! As always, if you have a favorite ride that would make a good Chapter ride, please let one of the road captains know!

## STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

**By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.**

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

**I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network.** Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges. Denial of a claim by an insurance provider must be received by Life Flight Network in writing. Membership benefits do not extend to transports deemed not medically necessary or when insurers deny payments due to coordination of benefit issues. Per government regulations, individuals covered by Medicaid are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership and should not apply.

**I specifically release and waive any and all rights, claims or causes of action against Life Flight Network and its employees and agents with respect to my Life Flight Network Membership.**
