Evolution...

As our riding season is beginning, we are running through our T-CLOCK pre-ride inspection. Looking closely at the machine that keeps us enjoying the open road, you can't help but marvel at how far it's come since its 1903 beginnings—especially with the introduction of the 2025 Harley-Davidson CVO Road Glide RR. More to come on that screamin' beauty!

This got me thinking... Harley-Davidson has produced many iconic motorcycles since it started in 1903. Here are some significant models that I found (thank you Google) that stand out:

1. **Model 5-D** (1909): This was Harley-Davidson's first motorcycle with a V-Twin Engine; which became a defining feature of the brand. Retail Price \$325 (today's dollars \$11,272)
2. **Model 11F** (1915): Introduced a three-speed transmission and electric lighting, showcasing innovation in motorcycle design. Retail Price \$275 (today's dollars \$8,649)
3. **Model D** (1929): Known for its affordability during the Great Depression. It featured a 45 cubic inch flathead V-Twin engine. Retail Price \$290 (today's dollars \$5,387)
4. **EL "Knucklehead"** (1936): A groundbreaking model with overhead valve engines, setting a new standard for performance and reliability. Retail Price \$380 (today's dollars \$8,386)
5. **Hydra-Glide** (1949): Introduced hydraulic front forks, improving ride comfort and handling. Retail Price \$600 (today's dollars \$7,956)

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6. **Sportster** (1957): A legendary model that became synonymous with speed and agility, appealing to a younger audience. Retail Price \$1,103 (today's dollars \$12,479)
7. **Electra Glide** (1965): The first Harley-Davidson with an electric starter, making it more accessible to riders. Retail Price \$1,645 (today's dollars \$16,466)
8. **FX Super Glide** (1971): Considered the first factory-custom motorcycle, blending elements of touring and sport bikes. Retail Price \$2,000 (today's dollars \$15,585)
9. **Fat Boy** (1990): A modern classic with a bold design. It gained fame in pop culture, including its appearance in "Terminator 2". Retail Price \$10,499 (today's dollars \$25,089)
10. **V-Rod** (2001): A bold departure for Harley-Davidson, combining cutting-edge performance with a sleek, modern design. Retail Price \$16,995 (today's dollars \$30,257)
11. **LiveWire** (2019): Harley-Davidson's first electric motorcycle, representing a leap into the future of motorcycling. Retail Price \$29,799 (today's dollars \$37,019)
12. **CVO Tri Glide** (2020): This was a groundbreaking addition to the Custom Vehicle Operations lineup. It was the first three-wheeled motorcycle to carry the prestigious CVO badge. Retail Price \$49,199 (today's dollars \$57,845)

Today, the **2025 Harley-Davidson CVO Road Glide RR** is a high-performance, limited-edition motorcycle inspired by Harley-Davidson's racing heritage. This motorcycle is a street-legal version of Harley-Davidson's King of the Baggers Factory Race Bikes, blending racing performance with luxury craftsmanship. Only 131 units will be produced, making it an exclusive collector's item. Retail Price \$110,000. *Out of 639 Harley-Davidson dealerships in the United States, only 131 will receive this bike. Each of these models reflects Harley-Davidson's evolution and its ability to adapt to changing times while maintaining its iconic identity.

At the January General Meeting, I announced this will be my last year as the Chapter editor. I have been asked to post the duties & responsibilities from the Chapter bylaws which state in Article V – Board of Directors, Section 7. Duties of Appointed Officers:

EDITOR

The Editor authors, edits and facilitates the distribution of Chapter publications; informs membership of events by publication in newsletter; shares appropriate National H.O.G. information and news in the newsletter; ensures electronic sharing of the newsletter is done appropriate to H.O.G. standards; ensures all forms of communications are approved by the Sponsor, Chapter Manager, Director, and Assistant Director before publication.

To carry out the job responsibilities:

- The Editor must review and be familiar with the National H.O.G. Chapter Handbook in order to be sure all standards outlined for Chapter communications are followed. A review should be done at least twice a year to check for any updates.
- The Editor should use the HOG.com/members website and emails from the Regional HOG Manager to glean information about National HOG events/news to pass on to the members.
- The Editor must attend all Board Meetings in order to stay informed of Chapter events, rides, business, etc.
- The Editor should attend New Member Orientation meetings, Road Captain Information and Calendar meetings, and general membership meetings to gather information on Chapter, as well as Dealership, happenings.
- At the beginning of the year, the Editor provides the Chapter Director a timeline to be included on board meeting agendas. It should include the deadline to submit articles; when the draft will be sent to board members to review; and final the publication date the newsletter will be made available to the membership.
- For each newsletter edition, the Editor requests standing articles from the Director, Chapter Manager, Membership Officer, Merchandise Officer, Lead Road Captain, Safety Officer, Volunteer Officer, Food Safety Officer, as well as encourage other board members to submit articles whenever they like.
- Annually, the Editor uploads all previous year's newsletters to a flash drive. The flash drive is then handed off to the Director, Historian, or Equipment Office to be placed in a locked file cabinet in the chapter shed at High Desert Harley-Davidson.

I am happy to talk to anyone who might be interested in the position. In addition, if requested, I would be happy to assist with the first couple of editions of *HOG SQUEALS* when they assume the duties of the Editor.

IMCHOG Riding Protocols and Recommendations

This journey began during the last riding season when our chapter was asked to place an increased emphasis on safety. With members coming from different HOG Chapters across the country and with so many different riding styles and rules within those chapters, the suggestion was brought forward that IMCHOG produce a document that lets our members know what is expected from them during rides and how we operate within the Intermountain Chapter of HOG. We are trying to get everyone singing from the same sheet of music so to speak.

Beginning with our previous director, this document began to take shape. This was then passed on to a committee of five road captains who expanded upon the original document and once this phase was completed, the document was sent to the current Road Captain Corps asking for review and feedback. Four more road captains provided feedback and these thoughts and opinions were worked into the document. With 1/3 of the current road captains having input into this document, one could say it has been peer reviewed. This was then brought before your Board of Directors and we now have the document you see today.

Please review the Riding Protocol and Recommendations document. This will reside on our webpage under Road Captain Resources.

INTERMOUNTAIN HOG CHAPTER RIDING GUIDELINES

The following are the Intermountain HOG Chapter guidelines we would like every rider to follow to make sure all of our rides are safe. These guidelines are intended to serve as basic recommendations for most group riding situations. Remember, you have the ultimate responsibility for your safety, and to always ride within your abilities and that of your machine. Also remember that while on our group rides or wearing your vests, we represent the HOG and High Desert Harley Davidson, so please ride accordingly.

1. All rides are done in a staggered formation, except when riding single file. This means the lead rider is in the left 1/3 of the lane and the next rider is in the right 1/3 of the lane. This is for bikes, trikes, and sidecar rigs. You should try to stay in this formation except when it is necessary to negotiate curves, avoid obstacles, or increase your visibility to other drivers. However, the entire width of the lane is for your use.
2. You should maintain a safe riding distance of approximately 1-2 seconds from the rider on the opposite side of the lane in front of you. This gives you a safe riding distance of approximately 2-4 seconds from the rider directly in front of you. When riding in single file formation, you should increase the distance to 2-4 seconds from the rider in front of you. Keeping this distance and not falling behind helps maintain the integrity of the ride and lessens the chance of the group getting separated.
3. If you get separated from the group but can still see the group in front of you, do not exceed the speed limit to catch up. If you lose contact with the group in front of you, either follow the route using the Harley App, written directions, or wait for another chapter member or road captain who knows the route to take over as temporary lead.
4. Both vehicle lights and hand signals should be used. Hand signals should be passed back by every rider so that they make it to the sweep at the end of the group.

5. All riders should adhere to all applicable Federal, State, and local laws governing the operation of motorcycles. This includes, but is not limited to, observing posted speed limits, obeying all traffic signals and signage, and following laws related to lane usage, overtaking, and passing other vehicles. Riders are also responsible for being aware of and complying with laws regarding the use of safety equipment, such as helmets, and any restrictions on riding in certain areas or on certain road types. Riders should remain vigilant and courteous, always exercising safe riding practices.
6. You should never pass a rider while in formation, at a stop sign, a stop light, or while coming into a parking lot. Maintain your position in the formation until the next scheduled stop unless it is unsafe to do so.
7. When passing another vehicle on an interstate highway, it should be completed one rider at a time. Each rider needs to verify it is safe to do so when it comes their turn. Once the pass is completed, maintain your speed so the rider behind you does not “hang out” in the passing lane.
8. Do not pass as a group and do not block the passing lane. This means you should not move into the left-hand lane until you reach the vehicle that you are passing.
9. If a rider needs to drop out of the formation, they need to do so in a safe manner, indicating so to the riders behind. All other riders should continue on, and the sweep will be the only one stopping with that rider. In case of an accident, other riders will likely stop to render aid. Once the sweep arrives on the scene, assist as directed by the sweep road captain. Those members not needed will be sent on to minimize the number of people and bikes creating an additional safety hazard.
10. When a rider drops out of formation and leaves a gap, all riders should maintain their position and not “close” the gap or switch sides of the lane. At the next scheduled stop, the gap may be filled in.
11. During the staging of the ride, you should place yourself in a position where you feel safe. If you prefer being in the back of the group, go there. If you do not feel safe riding behind a trike or a particular rider, then move to a different position within the group.
12. Any rider, no matter what they ride or their skill level, may ride anywhere in the formation that they feel safe.

If certain actions occur during a ride, you will be asked to leave the ride immediately:

1. Drinking alcohol, taking any illicit drug, or prescription medications that impair one’s ability to operate a motor vehicle. This includes showing up to a ride while under the influence.
2. There are other actions that will warrant personal attention from the Lead Road Captain if they occur during a ride:
 - a. Riding too close to the rider in front of you or making them feel pushed
 - b. Continually weaving or crossing the center line or being in the wrong lane on unmarked roads
 - c. Any other act that forces another rider into an unsafe riding condition
3. If there are further occurrences, you will be asked to meet with the chapter director, assistant director, lead road captain, and our sponsor (High Desert Harley Davidson) for further actions.

L2R - Training opportunities available for you to improve your riding and slow speed skills

As we begin another riding season, there is no better time to knock the rust off of your riding skills that may have accumulated over the winter. Whether you



are new to riding or have been setting in the saddle for forty years, we all have room to improve our riding skills or to break bad habits we may have picked up over the years.

There is a program available through High Desert Harley-Davidson called "Learn to Ride" <https://learntorideidaho.com/> that has sessions available for all types of riders - beginners and seasoned. Having to perform slow speed maneuvers around vehicles in parking lots or making a U-turn in the width of a highway while on a ride can cause increased stress in some riders. It has been said anyone can ride a motorcycle at high speeds but the slow speed maneuvers are also essential in keeping yourself safe. For only 495, the "Next Level Rider" will help instill these slow speed skills and show ways to overcome the apprehension that may occur whenever it is necessary to perform these maneuvers. There is no test required to complete this course.

A section of the Next Level Rider course focuses on pushing your motorcycle to the point of maximum braking. This is the point just before the ABS feature is activated or the bike begins to skid. If you have never applied the brakes on your bike to this point you are missing one of the fundamentals of riding and knowing what your motorcycle is capable of. It really is amazing how fast a motorcycle can be brought to a complete stop without going into a skid or the ABS feature being activated.

When I began this adventure of riding big road bikes several years back I took a beginners course. I have ridden dirt bikes most of my life but had never ridden a 900 lb. machine. The saying of "You don't know what you don't know" applied in this situation as I thought I was a fairly capable rider but quickly found out differently. The basic mechanics of handling the motorcycle were present but I was in for a rude awakening when it came to the skills required to handle a big bike during slow speed maneuvers.

Please consider taking this training opportunity to improve your riding skills as I am sure you will learn new or reinforce the excellent riding skills you already possess.

STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network. Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges. Denial of a claim by an insurance provider must be received by Life Flight Network in writing. Membership benefits do not extend to transports deemed not medically necessary or when insurers deny payments due to coordination of benefit issues.
