### INTERMOUNTAIN HOG CHAPTER RIDING GUIDELINES

The following are the Intermountain HOG Chapter guidelines we would like every rider to follow to make sure all of our rides are safe. These guidelines are intended to serve as basic recommendations for most group riding situations. Remember, you have the ultimate responsibility for your safety, and to always ride within your abilities and that of your machine. Also remember that while on our group rides or wearing your vests, we represent the HOG and High Desert Harley Davidson, so please ride accordingly.

1. All rides are done in a staggered formation, except when riding single file. This means the lead rider is in the left 1/3 of the lane and the next rider is in the right 1/3 of the lane. This is for bikes, trikes, and sidecar rigs. You should try to stay in this formation except when it is necessary to negotiate curves, avoid obstacles, or increase your visibility to other drivers. However, the entire width of the lane is for your use.
2. You should maintain a safe riding distance of approximately 1-2 seconds from the rider on the opposite side of the lane in front of you. This gives you a safe riding distance of approximately 2-4

seconds from the rider directly in front of you. When riding in single file formation, you should increase the distance to 2-4 seconds from the rider in front of you. Keeping this distance and not falling behind helps maintain the integrity of the ride and lessens the chance of the group getting separated.

3. If you get separated from the group but can still see the group in front of you, do not exceed the speed limit to catch up. If you lose contact with the group in front of you, either follow the route using the Harley App, written directions, or wait for another chapter member or road captain who knows the route to take over as temporary lead.
4. Both vehicle lights and hand signals should be used. Hand signals should be passed back by every rider so that they make it to the sweep at the end of the group.
5. All riders should adhere to all applicable Federal, State, and local laws governing the operation of motorcycles. This includes, but is not limited to, observing posted speed limits, obeying all traffic signals and signage, and following laws related to lane usage, overtaking, and passing other vehicles. Riders are also responsible for being aware of and complying with laws regarding the use of safety equipment, such as helmets, and any restrictions on riding in certain areas or on certain road types. Riders should remain vigilant and courteous, always exercising safe riding practices.
6. You should never pass a rider while in formation, at a stop sign, a stop light, or while coming into a parking lot. Maintain your position in the formation until the next scheduled stop unless it is unsafe to do so.
7. When passing another vehicle on an interstate highway, it should be completed one rider at a time. Each rider needs to verify it is safe to do so when it comes their turn. Once the pass is completed, maintain your speed so the rider behind you does not “hang out” in the passing lane.
8. Do not pass as a group and do not block the passing lane. This means you should not move into the left-hand lane until you reach the vehicle that you are passing.
9. If a rider needs to drop out of the formation, they need to do so in a safe manner, indicating so to the riders behind. All other riders should continue on, and the sweep will be the only one stopping with that rider. In case of an accident, other riders will likely stop to render aid. Once the sweep arrives on the scene, assist as directed by the sweep road captain. Those members not needed will be sent on to minimize the number of people and bikes creating an additional safety hazard.
10. When a rider drops out of formation and leaves a gap, all riders should maintain their position and not “close” the gap or switch sides of the lane. At the next scheduled stop, the gap may be filled in.
11. During the staging of the ride, you should place yourself in a position where you feel safe. If you prefer being in the back of the group, go there. If you do not feel safe riding behind a trike or a particular rider, then move to a different position within the group.
12. Any rider, no matter what they ride or their skill level, may ride anywhere in the formation that they feel safe.

If certain actions occur during a ride, you will be asked to leave the ride immediately:

1. Drinking alcohol, taking any illicit drug, or prescription medications that impair one’s ability to operate a motor vehicle. This includes showing up to a ride while under the influence.
2. There are other actions that will warrant personal attention from the Lead Road Captain if they occur during a ride:
  - a. Riding too close to the rider in front of you or making them feel pushed
  - b. Continually weaving or crossing the center line or being in the wrong lane on unmarked roads
  - c. Any other act that forces another rider into an unsafe riding condition
3. If there are further occurrences, you will be asked to meet with the chapter director, assistant director, lead road captain, and our sponsor (High Desert Harley Davidson) for further actions.



***BILL MULLEN ROCKER RIDE TO CELEBRATION PARK***

The ride forecast looked like it was supposed to be very windy, but someone must have put a good word since they were not near as strong as predicted. We had a total of 62 people on the ride. The breakout - 25 bikes, 17 trikes and 10 passengers. The lining up of the group was handled very well by Cliff Lewis.



Once the group was ready, we took off headed to Kuna. The stoplight at Overland Road/Locust Grove split everyone into many smaller groups; which was anticipated when the ride was planned. Once we were outside of Kuna on Swan Falls Road, other than a few vehicles staggered between us, the group was together again.



We made a short stop at Celebration Park, where the Rangers welcomed everyone and offered to stay open late, if needed, so everyone could take their time walking around. After 30-minutes, we loaded up and hit the road again for the return trip to High Desert Harley-Davidson.

We rode back via Map Rock Road and Lake Shore Drive so riders could work out some winter riding cobwebs when it came to curves. During this stretch, we were able to stay rather close in formation, only separating so that photos could be taken by Jeff D’Agostino, Chapter Photographer.

We turned south on Highway 45 and once again traffic separated the group and we experienced some stronger winds. Nothing our HOG members couldn't handle and after all, this is Idaho so it is expected!

Overall, the ride went well with a few lessons learned by not only the perspective Road Captain, but some members as well. I learned that I need to remind ride participants to use hand signals and to pass them back to other riders. I also learned you have to adjust ride plans when road construction pops up after you do the pre-ride. Lastly, some riders learned that showing up 5 minutes before a ride is to take off, does not allow sufficient time to accomplish the sign-ins and safety brief.

Many thanks to those that came out to support me on my final test of earning the Road Captain Rocker. I could not have done it without them and a cast of great people. Thanks to Cliff Lewis (my mentor), Jamie Allies and Bill Ream (mids), Brett Allies (sweep) and Jeff D'Agostino (photographer). If I missed anyone, please accept my thanks as well.

## **OWYHEE DAM RIDE**

This will be the 15th annual ride to the Gordon Gulch Day Use Area on Lake Owyhee. Besides the great ride, the main purpose is to hopefully see the lake full and spilling over the Glory Hole. With all the water we have been getting this year it is a good possibility you will get to see this awesome sight.

This ride will go into Oregon so you will need a helmet. You can also bring a lunch to have at the park when we get there or stop at a restaurant on the way back. It will be approximately 70 miles one way. The first 45 miles are on easy two lane country roads. The next 23 miles are on a narrow two lane with much of it having no center marker. The last three miles are steep, narrow, winding, and has no guard rails. This is a popular camping and fishing location so there may be a lot of RV traffic with boats, trailers, and motorhomes.

Our route will start at the Home Depot in Eagle and travel down Highway 44 and turn left on Old Highway 30. We will turn left on Oasis (it turns into Market Road) and will take us to Parma on Highway 26. Our only scheduled stop will be at the Valley Country Store. If you don't have your helmets on at this point, please put them on when we leave. We will go through the city of Parma, and turn left on Highway 18/Roswell Blvd and go through the town of Roswell (aliens may or may not be seen). We will then turn right on Highway 452 and cross the Snake River into Oregon. We will turn onto Highway 201 and go through the town of Adrian. We will turn left on Overstreet and follow it to Owyhee Lake Road. This section is the most picturesque; riding along the Owyhee River through red rock canyons. Others may choose to head back and stop at a restaurant in one of the many towns on the way back. For those that want you may follow me back a different route to enjoy more of the farmlands.

## STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

**By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.**

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

**I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network.** Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges.
