Creating Memories, One Event at a Time

As many of you know, the Rockies2Pacific Event is happening on June 19th to 22nd. Although not a HOG Rally, we have 35 HOG Chapters being represented and over 360 people signed up! What a great way to meet like-minded Harley enthusiasts!

How did events like this get their start? National HOG began organizing rallies almost immediately after its founding in 1983. The first official event was the Magic Mountain Tour, a three-day ride through Colorado with 250 members. By 1984, HOG held the first national rallies in Reno, Nevada, and Nashville, Tennessee. As national membership grew, HOG's mission to connect riders and celebrate the passion of riding Harleys, was realized with the birth of regional rallies in 1986, followed by state rallies in 1988. Over time, HOG rallies evolved into global events, with Europe hosting its first rally in 1991, followed by Japan in 1996. Today, HOG rallies are held worldwide, offering us a mix of camaraderie, adventure, and Harley-Davidson culture.

Rockies2Pacific was started with a similar vision... to create an annual gathering of Harley enthusiasts every June, alternating between the Pacific and the Rocky Mountain regions. R2P's mission is to build camaraderie between regional HOG Chapters and provide the opportunity to showcase different chapters and dealerships.

As excited as we are to show off our incredible dealership High Desert Harley-Davidson and the BEST HOG Chapter in the World, the success of Rockies2Pacific will be fully realized when, at the end of a great day of riding, everyone is sitting around experiencing that very special "Intermountain HOG Family" feeling as they share laughter and stories about their day!

Now that the weather is more agreeable, our 2025 riding season has kicked off in earnest with two rides in April and five in May, one of them being our first overnighter of the season.

The first ride of the season took place on April 13th to Celebration Park where Bill Mullen earned his road captain rocker. This ride was quite large with 62 individuals, 25 bikes and 17 trikes but Bill handled the ride like the professional that he is. Congratulations Bill Mullen, welcome to the IMCHOG Road Captain Corps!

Our next ride was the annual Hagerman Brunch ride held on April 27th and led by Mason Clarke. The group of 49 members on 23 bikes and 15 trikes braved the ominous weather for a beautiful, though mildly damp, ride to the Snake River Grill in Hagerman for a delicious brunch.

The 40th annual ICMS Awareness Rally Ride to Lucky Peak and on to the State Capital escorted by law enforcement officers from around the Treasure Valley took place on May 3rd. I was proud to lead 32 HOG members riding on 17 bikes and 10 trikes. This was the largest group of HOG members supporting ICMS to date.

Dave Kesner led the 15th annual Owyhee Dam ride on May 4th with 26 HOG members on 12 bikes and 11 trikes. The weather was ominous when the ride began but cleared as the group approached the Owyhee Reservoir. This year the group was treated to water flowing over the Glory Hole spillway although not as much as it has in years past.

Our annual Spring Picnic sponsored by your Members at Large took place on Sunday May 18th with a ride from On the Run at Eiseman exit to Bear Creek Park in Meridian. The lunch was catered by Goodwood Barbecue. Thank you to all the Members at Large and their volunteers for making this such a huge success on a very windy day!

As our chapter continues to grow, we have doubled, and at times tripled, the number of individuals on our rides. These numbers make it ever more important for us to stay aware of our surroundings, that includes our fellow riders. We are a diverse group of riders with experience levels from novice through multiple years of riding. Your road captains have put time into providing each member with as safe a riding environment as possible.

Let me note two aspects that will help reduce “surprises” from behind. The first is, should a rider fall out of their staggered position during a ride that is in progression, do not try to fill that position until the group comes to the next scheduled stop. The second is, during our rides we discourage “blocking” from behind during a passing event on an interstate or two laners. The sheer length of our group encourages cages to make aggressive decisions to pass us. This usually results in our safety being put in jeopardy. Remember: move up behind the vehicle you are going to pass to put you in position to safely pass; take your bike off cruise control, if you are using it; keep on the throttle to get past the vehicle you are passing; and do not move back into the other lane immediately so you do not ‘cut them off’. This will also allow other riders behind you the space to complete their pass. If you will remember to always pass in the same manner that you would on a two-lane highway, most if not all of these issues can be avoided.

Ride safe, keep your head on a swivel, but most importantly, have fun!

I am not sure what is going on with our HOG group but only 26 people showed up for the Owyhee Dam ride on Sunday, May 4th with 12 bikes and 11 trikes. It may have been the ominous dark clouds or the breezy wind but as everyone knows Dr Dave's rides go unless there is ice on the road. In the past there have been as many as 85 people on this ride.



By the time we headed out at 10:30 the clouds had already started clearing and continued to get better by the minute and the mile ending up with blue skies by the time we got there. 

STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network. Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges. Denial of a claim by an insurance provider must be received by Life Flight Network in writing. Membership benefits do not extend to transports deemed not medically necessary or when insurers deny payments due to coordination of benefit issues.
