### *What About That Patch?*

With Rockies 2 Pacific kicking off right around the corner, it made me think of all 31 Chapters being represented...with the same mission in mind, Ride and Have Fun! I suspect the first thing I'll look at when meeting someone new is where they're from checking out their rocker. That thought rolled into asking how these patches came about. Well, here goes...



Motorcycle patches have a rich and rebellious history that's deeply woven into the fabric of biker culture—quite literally.

The tradition began in the 1920s when the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) was formed. Riders attending AMA events would stitch their club names onto jackets or vests for identification. After World War II, returning veterans formed motorcycle clubs seeking camaraderie and adrenaline, and patches became a way to express identity, loyalty, and shared values.

A pivotal moment came in 1947 during a riot in Hollister, California. The AMA reportedly claimed that 99% of motorcyclists were law-abiding, implying that 1% were outlaws. Some bikers embraced this label, wearing a "1%" patch to signify their outsider status. This marked the rise of outlaw motorcycle clubs (OMCs), like the Hells Angels and Outlaws, who adopted elaborate three-piece patches to represent their club name, territory, and logo

### *What about our HOG patch...where does it fit in?*

The evolution of the HOG Chapter patch is a fascinating ride through Harley-Davidson's visual identity and community spirit.

Originally, local HOG Chapter patches followed a pretty consistent format: the large national HOG eagle emblem centered on the back of a vest or jacket, with a rocker-style patch above it displaying the chapter name and location. This setup became iconic — a badge of pride and belonging that told the world where you rode from and who you rode with.

The core structure remains deeply respected: the eagle, the chapter rocker, and the sense of unity they represent. Even as styles evolve, many of us still gravitate toward the traditional look because it carries the weight of legacy and shared miles. However, as time passes the newer will become the traditional...as it should be!

The next riding opportunity is the return of a popular ride that our Chapter, along with HOG Chapters worldwide, did beginning in 2008 called The Million Miles Monday Ride; the goal was to rack up one million miles in one day across the globe. While National HOG has moved on to other challenges, this year's Stanley Loop Ride on Monday, June 30th, led by Mason Clarke, will honor that endeavor. As a chapter policy we hold the belief that no rider is ever left behind by the sweep but we are all human and mistakes are sometimes made. With our chapter continuing to grow and our rides becoming larger it is a major chore for all the road captains, but primarily the sweep to keep all the cats headed in the same direction, so to speak.

If a member, who is riding towards the front of a thirty-bike formation, pulls off to use the bathroom or has mechanical issues inside of a metropolitan area, and the sweep is ½ mile back or stuck at the light two streets back, without some sort of communication, there is no possible way for the sweep to know they have lost a rider. In addition, it is tough for the sweep to recognize or know every bike that is in their group. With this being said, a little help from the affected rider, i.e. a wave of the hand or flagging down the sweep, would not only be the prudent thing to do but is also very much appreciated by all of our road captains as we take the belief that we leave no rider behind very much to heart.

Just a little about myself - I served in the Air Force for 21 years. I then transitioned to a DoD civilian career for another 21 years. During that time, I took on the duties of a unit Motorcycle Safety Representative. My duties were to promote safety for not only military riders but civilian riders as well. I performed that role for 15 years and oversaw one of the larger riding units on Mountain Home Air Force Base. Justin asked me if I would summarize a great article he found as it relates to how military thinking could improve your riding. The article is very informative and one that caused me to think about things more as I ride.



When we ride, we are constantly sorting through many distractions and deciphering vast amounts of information in a short period of time. This is very similar to how many military members handle various situations. In the military (who like acronyms) this is called the OODA Loop.

Allow me a few minutes to break this down.

- OBSERVE: the situation
  - When it comes to motorcycle riding, we do this all the time. Think of your last ride and that vehicle approaching from the side ride at a high rate of speed. We wonder if they will stop, do they see us.
- ORIENT: ourselves to the situation mentally, predicting what may happen next
  - Do I need to slow down or what evasive action will I take
- DECIDE: what course of action is best situated based on our needs
  - Let off the throttle and prepare to respond
- ACT: apply the action needed to start that process

Stress when riding comes in many variations but is often associated with things outside of our control. We have no say in the weather, road conditions or the actions of others on the road. Those things we cannot control but what we can control is how to mitigate that stress. We should focus not on stress but how we match our response to that stress. We need to separate what we can control from what we cannot control. While we cannot control that driver on their cellphone, we can control how we respond to it. This often happens before the ride starts by doing things like simple maintenance, planning out the route to avoid known high traffic areas, selecting the right protective gear.

The last part I want to present had the most impact on me. Now that we have done all we can to mitigate things to the best of our abilities, let's focus on reducing stress. This is done in two ways: physical skillset and mental approach. For the physical skillset, we accomplish this by riding within our skill level, abilities and comfort level. We can improve this by attending riding clinics and learning from other riders. In that manner, we are better equipped to handle various situations and conditions. For the mental approach, imagine you are on your bike and time is frozen around you. You have a physical bubble around you and as you look around, you decide what is allowed to enter that bubble. It is your bubble, and you control what affects you.

In closing, I want to thank you for listening and remember to get into your bubble when riding, it is where champions live.

## STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

**By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.**

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

**I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network.** Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges.
