Sturgis 2025: Eighty-Five Years!

I was thinking about what to write for our August Edition of HOG Squeals. And it hit me...it's August...what happens in August besides kids going back to school??



STURGIS!

You know how I love the legacy of things. So, what could I dig up about how Sturgis began and then report on its 85th Anniversary? What started in 1938 as a humble race among nine riders has grown into the largest motorcycle rally in the world.

Founded by **Clarence "Pappy" Hoel**, a local Indian Motorcycle dealer and member of the **Jackpine Gypsies**, the original rally featured stunts, races, and a flaming-wall crash that set the tone for decades of daring. Back then, it was called the **Black Hills Motor Classic**—a name that still echoes in the hills for those who remember the roots.

Over the decades, the rally evolved from racing and hill climbs to a full-blown cultural phenomenon. By the 1970s, it had become a weeklong event, drawing riders from across the country. In 2015, the 75th anniversary shattered records with 739,000 attendees.

Fast forward to 2025, the rally this year welcomed **over 576,000 visits with 537,459 bikes** rolling into town. It was reported that the streets of Sturgis were alive with chrome, camaraderie, and the unmistakable rumble of Harley-Davidsons.

Of course, with those numbers, it had its share of challenges...

93 crashes...66 of which had injuries

4 fatalities...one of which was reported to be from the Treasure Valley. His name has not been released as of this article.

- **Charity rides, veteran tributes**, and community breakfasts that reminded everyone why they ride

Sturgis isn't just a destination—it's a tradition. It's where generations of riders come together to honor the past and rev up for the future. The rally now generates nearly **\$900 million** in statewide impact, but its real value is in the connections made and the memories forged.

As one anonymous, longtime HOG member put it:

“Sturgis isn't just about the bikes—it's about the people. It's the stories, the shared miles, and the sound of engines echoing through the hills.”

So whether you've been there in past years, rode out this year or are considering 2026, the spirit of Sturgis lives in every mile we ride, every handshake we share, and every squeal we "safely" send out to the world.

Thanks to new enhancements to the [H-D App](#), H.O.G. members can now view their mileage achievements easily from a phone or mobile device. Connecting a membership profile to the app allows riders to see how many miles they have accumulated H.O.G.'s Ride 365 Annual and Lifetime challenges and how close they are to their next reward milestone. Riders can also use the H-D App to build and track rides, find nearby events, join riding challenges and connect with fellow riders online.

To enter the Ride 365 and Let's Ride Challenge challenges, riders must continue having odometer readings taken at a Harley-Davidson dealership. Miles recorded with the H-D App will not be automatically enrolled into challenges.



Keeping your cool while riding during the heat of the summer!

As we enter the summer riding season with its increased ambient temperatures being prepared for these extreme conditions is important. When you ride long distances in the intense summer heat, dehydration, heat exhaustion, and heatstroke can sneak up on you before you're aware of what's happening.

So, it pays to know the warning signs, how to react when you experience them, and, most importantly, how to prevent them from happening in the first place.

The human body has a remarkable thermoregulation system. Under most circumstances, it does a great job of keeping your innards at an ideal 98.6 degrees Fahrenheit. When things outside your body get too hot, it has ways to accommodate.

The first thing it does is sweat. Glands in the skin secrete moisture, which draws heat from the body through evaporation. That's why the phrase "it's a dry heat" really does have meaning. In the desert, this process works quite efficiently. Sweat evaporates from your skin before you even know it's there, taking excess heat with it. If you find yourself thinking, "I'm not even sweating!" – you are. You just don't feel it.

In more humid environments, your body sweats, but the air is already so moist it can't evaporate easily. And if it can't evaporate, it can't do its job. The sweat and heat that stay on your body make you feel hot, sticky, and uncomfortable.

Your body is also cooled through "convection." Scientifically speaking, this means the removal of heat through the circulation of air. In motorcycle speak, this is that wind-in-your-face feeling we all love. And in the heat, the wind can be a lifesaver.

Skin is Not in When Riding a Motorcycle in Hot Weather

One of the most common mistakes of riding a motorcycle in the heat is thinking that exposing more skin by wearing less clothing will help you cool off. And while riding in a T-shirt or tank top may help you feel a little cooler in the short run, it's bad practice for the long haul.

For starters – and this may seem obvious – more exposed skin puts you at greater risk for painful sunburn. And let's face it: While it works for some people, not all of us are in a hurry to sport that "grizzled biker" look!

If you're going to be riding a motorcycle in the extreme summer heat, the most important thing is to take care of your skin. Wear high-quality sunblock that has an SPF 30 or higher rating and apply it regularly throughout the day.

Stay Hydrated

When you head out on a summer motorcycle ride in the heat – particularly when you go without a fairing or windshield – the wind in your face draws moisture from exposed skin, even as it provides a cooling sensation. This helps deplete your body's water supply. The old axiom "Drink before you feel thirsty" certainly holds true on a motorcycle trip.

How Much to Drink to Stay Hydrated

Drink small amounts frequently—a little bit of water every 20 minutes or so will help keep you hydrated and feeling good throughout the day.

Plain water is best, but sports drinks are a good option. However, since you're not burning many calories on your motorcycle (unlike those triathletes), replacing your electrolytes and "refueling" are not as critical. Plain old H₂O is what your body needs most.

Know the Warning Signs

When your body starts to run low on fluids, it loses some of its ability to cool itself through the evaporation of sweat, and a process called "vasodilation" begins. This simply means that the blood vessels near your skin get larger, resulting in increased blood flow closer to the surface, which helps dissipate heat. The problem is that this results in decreased blood flow to other important body parts, such as your muscles and your brain.

With that in mind, if you start feeling a little weary, hang out in the air conditioning for a while; it's best not to hurry when the heat is on. And be alert for other signs of heat stress.

- Heavy sweating
- Extreme weakness or fatigue
- Dizziness, confusion
- Nausea
- Clammy, moist skin
- Pale or flushed complexion
- Muscle cramps
- Slightly elevated body temperature
- Fast and shallow breathing

If you start to experience any of these, get off the road, find some shade (or air-conditioning), and plenty of water. Drink it. Pour it on your head and neck. Do whatever you can to lower your core temperature. Lie down if you need to and elevate your feet to help increase blood flow to your brain.

In the Heat of the Day

Let's say your plan for the day is a 500-mile ride across the desert. Your first heat-fighting measure is to start early when it's cooler. In fact, it may even be cool enough you need to add a layer before starting.

Beyond the mesh jacket and long-sleeve T-shirt, other motorcycle gear choices can help you keep cool. Something as simple as a wet bandana around your neck or under your helmet can do wonders. Soaking your T-shirt helps a lot.

If you ride in high temperatures frequently, consider investing in a "hydration vest" and "neck scarves" lined with crystals that absorb and hold water to keep you cool while you ride. Wearing a jacket over top of your cooling vest may seem counterproductive but it will allow the vest to remain damp approximately four times longer.

Most of our newer bikes have vents that are adjustable, allowing you to control the amount of air that flows across your body and many modular and full-face helmets also have adjustable vents.

Remember, both you and your motorcycle are air-cooled. When you're stuck in traffic, the airflow stops and if it looks like a long delay, it may best to get off the road and wait it out.

As mentioned above, don't forget to use sunscreen on any exposed skin, especially covering spots like the back of your neck, the backs of your hands, or that little gap you might have between your gloves and the ends of your sleeves. Cover as much of your skin as possible.

We hope you find these tips helpful if you're riding a motorcycle in hot weather. Always remember that "Safety Comes First!"

If it feels too hot for your comfort level, pull over and wait until the weather cools down before continuing on your journey.

Your body does a great job of cooling itself and with a little help, it can do an even better job and hopefully make the hottest rides safer and a more comfortable.

Ride safe, keep your head on a swivel, but most importantly, Have Fun!

STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

By becoming a Life Flight Network Member, you agree to the terms stated below.

A Life Flight Network Membership relieves you from liability for out-of-pocket costs of emergent, medically necessary transports completed and billed by Life Flight Network. Your membership is not an insurance policy but secondary to insurance carriers and health care cost sharing programs. All available insurances will be billed first including health, auto, workers compensation and third-party insurance. Life Flight Network will accept payment from insurance carriers and other third party payers as payment in full.

Membership benefits are available for those eligible household members listed on the member record at the time of transport if the transport is an emergent, medically necessary transport to the closest, most appropriate facility, performed by Life Flight Network, its contracted agents, or reciprocal partners, subject to the reciprocal program's rules.

Membership benefits are extended to the primary member, his/her spouse or domestic partner and dependents claimed on their income tax return. Dependents must be added to the member record within 30 days of birth or adoption. Elderly (age 65+) and disabled family members living in the same household are also covered. Life Flight Network may require documentation or other verification of membership eligibility.

Emergency medical transports are based on medical need, not membership status. Medical need can only be determined by a physician, EMS provider, hospital or another qualified third-party recognized by Medicare, and is in all cases subject to the final determination of the health insurance carrier, if any.

Non-emergent transports are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership benefits.

Availability of service cannot be guaranteed due to weather conditions, maintenance, commitment to another transport, out-of-service equipment, and other reasons.

New and lapsed membership benefits take effect upon receipt of a completed enrollment with payment.

Membership fees are non-refundable, non-transferable and are not tax-deductible. Life Flight Network may cease selling and servicing memberships should any governmental body, now or in the future, determine memberships can no longer be offered within their jurisdiction. No refunds will be made for any memberships already purchased.

I transfer directly to Life Flight Network my rights to insurance payments due to me for services provided by Life Flight Network. Such payments shall not exceed Life Flight Network's regular charges. Denial of a claim by an insurance provider must be received by Life Flight Network in writing. Membership benefits do not extend to transports deemed not medically necessary or when insurers deny payments due to coordination of benefit issues. Per government regulations, individuals covered by Medicaid are not eligible for Life Flight Network membership and should not apply.
